PRESIDENT'S (CHAIRMAN) REPORT

Our football program continues to make me incredibly proud. In the last four years we have taken significant steps forward to ensure that our vision *"To be acknowledged in all respects as the premier club of the SANFL"* is what continues to inspire us and that our mission *"The diligent pursuit of excellence and success through continuous club wide improvement..."* is what drives our daily actions and behaviours.



While 2019 did not deliver those elusive premierships, everyone at the Club is committed to the vision and mission and we will continue to provide our players and coaches with our upmost support.

It is with great satisfaction I announce a sixth consecutive operating surplus. Although a conservative figure (taking out the \$275,000 AAMI Stadium Land Divestment payment) it is a credit to the Board, Management and staff who worked diligently to achieve this despite BarZaar's trading decline.

In last year's report I described the recent journey of our Club as moving from survival, to consolidation and to growth. The Club has progressed into the growth phase and our Building the Blues campaign has helped deliver Stage I of the Unley Oval Redevelopment Project.

We now boast four unisex change rooms that enables us to showcase up to three games on match days. All players appreciate their new and upgraded facilities, with opposition clubs rating our away rooms the best in the League.

Stage II remains an absolute priority and we are working with City of Unley on its design. The Council have committed a further \$1.2 million to this Stage of the project. There remains an estimated balance of up to \$3 million to finish. We are regularly meeting with State and Federal Governments and other sectors to obtain grant funding. We are confident that our business case will deliver a multi-purpose, community hub atop the Jack Oatey Grandstand for all our supporters and Unley community to enjoy.

I acknowledge the efforts of our Senior Coach, Nathan Grima in his first season at the Club. He took us to our fourth consecutive men's league final's series and although we did not progress past the elimination final I am confident that under his direction, the Club's football programs have a clear focus going into Season 2020. We can all look forward with interest watching his recruits and our home-grown talent jostle for positions in the men's senior side.

Congratulations to all the players who provide inspiration and aspiration for us all. We say thank you and goodbye to premiership players Josh Dodd, Fraser Evans, John Greenslade, Ben Hansen, Aidan Riley and Jack Stephens. These players will be forever etched in our Club's rich and vibrant history.

To players Ed Allan, Tom Condon, Danyle Pearce, Sean Samblich and Henry Voigt the Club appreciates your contributions and wish you all the best as you continue your football journey at other clubs.

At just two season's old our senior women's program is steadily establishing itself. The Club prides itself on an inclusive culture – it's in our "Blue Genes". We believe if we get the culture right, results will follow. Our end of season player survey has confirmed we are on the right track with culture and inclusiveness rated highly.

The Club's commitment to gender equality is evident throughout the League. Sue Dewing remains the first and only female CEO in the SANFL. Jenny Hurley and Carol Hutchings enter their third year as Board members. Jenny is the Club's inaugural Patron of Women's Football and Carol recently became the first female League Director.

To remain at the top of our game we need to continue to change. With almost half our fan base women, our Club needs to reflect those who are supporting our game and we do that very well.

The strength of our Club is founded in our zone. I congratulate Chris Trapp, Michael Higgs and David Oatey for their dedication and efforts working with metropolitan and regional clubs, communities and colleges as part of the Club's pathway program.

This year we formed the "Blue-Sky" committee made up of people from a variety of industries, demographics and experience. The committee has been tasked with exploring long term strategies that will ensure the Club's future sustainability, without gaming, as a major revenue source. The Committee assist the Board and management in decision making across a diverse range of commercial activities that will further enhance business development opportunities.

CEO'S REPORT

Season 2019 saw us realise a long-held dream in the opening of our new and redeveloped changeroom facilities at Unley Oval. The facilities (currently the best in the League) provided us with the opportunity to host triple headers that included our senior women's team and an AFLW game.



Despite having changeroom facilities that we can be rightly proud of we are only part way through the Unley Oval Redevelopment Project. The yet to be built Stage II will include a multi-purpose community hub in the Jack Oatey Grandstand that will overlook Unley Oval.

The Club has been working tirelessly in conjunction with the City of Unley on the Stage II design. We are in the process of submitting a Development Application for approval so as the project is shovel ready, a condition generally required by government for the distribution of grant funding.

Over the last six years the Club and football has contributed \$1.5 million into Unley Oval upgrades. We believe this investment has been vital in the delivery of quality football programs that can accommodate a continually changing environment as directed by the AFL. It is also of vital importance that we continue to provide a first-class experience for all our members and supporters.

I thank the City of Unley for their continued financial support in the upgrade of Unley Oval. The Club and Council see Unley Oval as the centrepiece of the Unley community, and we will continue to work together improving a facility for all to share and enjoy.

As is normal, the season presented various challenges and opportunities both on and off field. We would not have been able to address these without the right people in place and led by our President, Jason Kilic who has set the Club's standards and mission of continuous improvement.

We proudly post our sixth successive operational surplus and have further reduced our debt. Those are words I feared I would never pen upon my appointment as CEO in late 2013.

Our hospitality venue BarZaar's gaming revenue declined like the state-wide gaming trend. Whilst we forecast an improvement for 2020, we will continue to diligently explore alternate revenue opportunities.

I thank and acknowledge all sponsors for their contribution to the financial sustainability of the Club. A special thank you to Major Sponsor Morris Finance Limited, Oval Sponsor Australian Gas Networks and Junior Sponsor Thomas Farms Kitchen.

In acknowledging that the SA football environment has many challenges, I am confident that your Club has laid a strong foundation as we optimistically head into season 2020. I therefore encourage you all to renew your membership and continue to enlist family and friends into the Sturt family.

FOOTBALL MANAGER'S REPORT

Season 2019 saw a new chapter in the history of the Sturt Football Club with the appointment of Senior Coach Nathan Grima.



After a consistent season filled with some great wins as well as some close losses the League men finished in 4th position at the conclusion of the minor round. This earned us a spot in the Elimination Final against Norwood where after a spirited effort and comeback we went down by 14 points.

Sustained success is a major goal for the Club so it was pleasing to again make the finals for a fourth year in succession, however winning League Premierships is the Club's main goal and we will continue to improve and strive for the ultimate success in season 2020.

Sustained success of the Senior and Junior programs is difficult to achieve and wouldn't be possible without the direction and support of the Board, in particular Jason Kilic as President and Chris Thredgold as Football Director. Jason and Chris are a fantastic support for the football department and lead us in a positive direction as we strive for continuous improvement.

2019 was the first season with access to the new changeroom and gym facilities under the Oatey Grandstand. These facilities are first class and are greatly appreciated by the playing and coaching group. They play a major role in allowing the playing group to achieve its full potential through quality medical, strength and conditioning, recovery and learning environments.

The Senior coaching group led by first year Senior Coach Nathan Grima worked diligently to provide a high performance learning and playing environment.

Nathan was well supported by experienced League assistants Ben Warren (midfield), Chad Simmons (defence) and Troy Hall (forwards) who all have an excellent rapport with players and provided excellent direction and communication to the group.

The strength and conditioning program was once again headed up by Hayden Conlay with great assistance from Lawson Daly. Hayden (League) and Lawson (Reserves) were also valuable as runners for the season.

Todd Boughen was new to the coaching group and took on the bench coach role. His ability to communicate messages to the players from the box and keep calm in high pressure situations was excellent.

Simon Feast again worked with the tall players and ruck group providing them with invaluable knowledge and expertise.

I again thoroughly enjoyed coaching the Reserves squad. The group progressed to the Preliminary Final with an average age of only 19 which bodes well for an exciting future for the Club.

The Sturt Women's team played their second season in the SANFLW competition and were once again well organised by Michael Higgs (Women's Football Manager) and Danijel Herbut (Senior Coach).

Danijel has retired from the women's coaching position and we wish him well in the future. Bruce Dawes has been appointed as the new SANFLW coach and will bring a wealth of coaching experience to the role.

David Oatey (U18s) and Michael Higgs (U16s) took control of the Sturt youth teams and along with their assistant coaches continue to do a brilliant job of fostering the young talent in our promotional zone.

The Club has a philosophy to develop local players for AFL and SANFL League football and we look forward to seeing many of these young players progress through the ranks in future years.

We had some key retirements in 2019 including past premiership players Aidan Riley, Jack Stephens, Fraser Evans, John Greenslade, Ben Hansen and Josh Dodd. We thank them for their great contribution to the Club and wish them all the best in retirement.

Our focus now turns to recruiting and development of our next crop of Premiership players who will uphold the values of the Sturt Football Club and wear the Double Blue guernsey with pride.

2020 brings with it a new season and great expectations from the Senior playing group who are hungry for success.

CLUB COACH REPORT

I've had a passion for the SANFL since I played in the competition in 2007, so I was excited to take on the role of Head Coach at Sturt when the opportunity presented.

Whilst I share the disappointment of all our members and supporters with a first week exit from finals, I feel there was still plenty of positives from the season.



Carrying on from recent years we were again a very strong defensive team: we had a big focus on restricting opposition possession by limiting uncontested and therefore opposition offence. Our success at this was highlighted in key statistics relating to defence. Across the League, we allowed least scoring shots, possessions, kicks, handballs and marks against us. We had the second lowest of scores kicked against us, inside 50s allowed and shots allowed per inside 50.

Being a strong defensive team enabled us to be a winning chance in most games. Only the two teams that played off in the grand final won more quarters than us in the regular season. Along with our 11 wins I felt we were in a position to win the game on other occasions - late into the last quarter against Norwood Round 3, Glenelg Round 4, Adelaide Round 11 and Port Adelaide in Round 17. However, we were unable to impact the scoreboard when we had momentum. As such we fell half a game short of a top three finish.

Offensively, we weren't at the level required to be a top three team and improving this has shaped our recruiting. Offensive strategies will be our number one focus over summer. The key offensive statistics were disappointing – across the League we were the second lowest scoring side, second lowest for shots on goal, third lowest for inside 50s and had the lowest shots per inside 50.

We were able to give 34 players the opportunity to play League football this season, this is more than in any season in four years. Of these 34, 27 came via our junior program. We also had 8 players debut, of which 6 played in our junior program.

Being able to tell a player they are going to debut is one of the most enjoyable parts of the coaching job. I feel all our young guys that debuted this season looked more than capable of going on to become quality League footballers.

We were able to retain most of our list from the 2018 season, with noticeable departures in Jack Osborn and Rory Taggart to retirement and Shane McAdam to the Adelaide Crows.

We added Danyle Pearce, Josh Patullo and Tom Condon. All three slotted in well with the group and contributed throughout the season. Josh went on to lead the League in contested marks and we look forward to seeing him grow and develop next season.

It's always sad to see players depart, however retirements are a part of the game. A huge hole will be left after the departure of Fraser Evans, John Greenslade, Jack Stephens, Aidan Riley, Ben Hansen and Josh Dodd. They have been top quality premiership players – beyond that, they are all great people and leave knowing they had a huge impact on the club.

It is always great to see a local player return at the end of their AFL career and to have Pearcey for even one year is a testament to himself and his passion for the club - after 250 AFL games he wanted to return home to Sturt. His football still stacks up and his experience within the group was great, however he feels the time is right to spend more time with his family and continue his transition into the next stage of his life.

When you have higher than usual list changes, there comes a level of excitement as we have greater scope to recruit as well as create space for our younger players who are craving more opportunity at League level. Our focus is a commitment to develop young, local players.

In closing, I would like to thank all involved in the Sturt Football Club for making myself, Jacinta, Amarli and Spencer part of the Sturt family and feeling so welcomed. I would also like to thank all players on list, staff, support staff, volunteers and members for the 2019 season.

I am excited by what lies ahead and cannot wait to get the players back on deck for the first night of preseason in November.

HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGER'S REPORT

The Under 18 Centre of Excellence program was thoroughly enjoyed by all players and staff in 2019. The group of players showed great commitment to pursuing their goal of “being as good as they can be” and their team spirit and care for each other and our club was excellent.



The main aim of this program is to get as many players as possible to play AFL or SANFL senior football and the program offered well over 200 hours of training and playing for the players to pursue their dreams.

We selected 61 players in this squad and at years end we had played 61 players in the Under 18 team in an official match. This is a huge number of players and it requires patience and care by all staff members to enable the program to run smoothly and effectively.

In the Under 18 team we played 6 Under 16 players, 27 Under 17 players, 27 Under 18 players and 1 Under 19 player. 22 of these players were College students, so this meant that when school football was played from May through to September, they were not available for selection at Sturt. This is a major reason we play so many players. The other factor that limits winning is when players play State or senior football (it is hard to win games when your best players are not playing for their team).

The main aim of our program is to get players to senior football, so we feel great pride and success from our program when players get to play State or senior football. We had 5 players represent South Australia in the U18 National Championships (Oliver Grivell, Anzac Lochowiak, Jed McEntee, Josh Shute and Lachlan Burrows) and also had 11 players play Reserves football for Sturt (Anzac Lochowiak, Jed McEntee, Josh Shute, Cooper Hough, Dailan How, Harry Weeks, Will Crane, Declan Fahey, Joel Parker-Boers, Hudson Laycock and James Borlase) with Oliver Grivell and Joel Parker-Boers also playing League football for Sturt.

The players showed great commitment to their training, even when the team could no longer play finals, there were still 55 players on the training track on Monday or Tuesday night in the final week of the program. The players continued to work hard and showed a strong bond all season. There were over 85 people at the end of season presentation evening, this is a great number and showed that the cohort had a strong bond to Sturt.

Season 2019 saw the team finish seventh, winning 5 games and losing 13. This was not a true reflection of the quality of the Under 18 group because many of the better players were playing Reserves or college for most of the year. It meant that we got to have a look at more Under 17 players and it should be good for their future development.

At seasons end we awarded five trophies to recognise outstanding achievement during the season. Best and Fairest (Simon John Pfeiffer Medal) was won by Cooper Hough. Runner Up Best and Fairest (Jackson Marsh Memorial Trophy) was won by Will Crane. Best Team Man (Frank Dodd Memorial Trophy) and the Defenders award was won by Lachlan Paddick. The Forwards award was won by Marshall Howe and the Midfielders award was won by Tully Kennett.

In his first year as senior coach Nathan Grima was a huge support and was often on the oval with the Under 18 players on a Monday night working on their skills and craft. The players and coaches benefitted greatly from his knowledge.

Chris Trapp was fully supportive of the program and his leadership and communication was greatly appreciated in a year when many players were moving between Under 18 and Reserves.

The assistant coaches, Paul Scott, Bruce Dawes, Alex Guy, Joe Hargreaves, Michael O'Connor, Pat Sim and Sam Spain did a wonderful job developing the players. It is always hard to coach when there is such a large turnover of players each week, but the coaches approached the challenges with a clear desire to help every player improve every week, regardless of what the scoreboard said each week.

Our fitness and goal setting staff, Jackson Lane, Brenden Bishop and Simon Starr did a great job ensuring that every session elicited an improvement by all the players and I saw huge growth both physically and emotionally in all players and these three men played a big part in this improvement.

Our medical staff, Tamara Lane, Raelee Oatey, Jen Truong, Nick Swingler and Kristain Ricci were fantastic, they get to games and trainings first and were last to leave and they were critical in helping the players play at their best each week.

Steve Rechner, Ian Norman and Fabian Muller were our team managers and they loved working with the players and their good humour and buoyant spirits were appreciated by all.

On behalf of the players, a big thank you to Chris Thredgold, Jason Kilic and the SFC board who have provided huge support to get a high-quality program in place and the players and staff enjoyed using the new gym and facilities in 2019.

I would like to thank the board and management for allowing me to coach at Sturt in 2019, it is a huge honour and thoroughly enjoyable working with everyone at Sturt.

CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE MANAGER'S REPORT

Season 2019 saw 106 U16 players invited to trial in the Pre-Christmas 5 week period. Of these 106 players 88 trialed and 50 were chosen in the 2019 U16 squad, included in the 50 were 8 U15's.



Over the season we saw a vast improvement and growth in both the playing and coaching group. The squad only won 2 of their seven games but they were the best team I have coached in my 3 years, in regard to the talent that we will have come through the club.

We had 6 players make the 34-man State squad, Brad Jefferies, Declan Hortle (who played as a bottom ager in the Futures Game in September), Hugo Kittel, Morgan Ferres, Archer Bawden and Lachlan Thomas who was named in the leadership group.

The Coaches awards were given out to Archer Bawden (Defenders), Will Spain (Midfield) and Morgan Ferres (Forwards). With Runner Up Best and Fairest going to Lachlan Thomas and Brad Jefferies winning the Best and Fairest.

I had great support from my coaching team again and would like to thank them all. I would like to make a special mention to Tamara Lane who came on as our Centre of Excellence Head Trainer and did a wonderful job going above and beyond her role.

We continued our Development Squads in 2019 with Under 13, 14 and 15 Metro Teams, Under 14 and 15 Country Teams, SAPSASA in the Hills and Barker District's and the Next Generation Academy in Murray Bridge which we run with the help of the Adelaide Football Club.

These programs saw the SANFL organise a 5-game competition which we played a mix of our metro and country squads before topping up with Metro V Country games to ensure each player plays a minimum of 2 games.

We saw 390 players through these programs and our strong relationship with our local clubs and leagues continued.

We had great volunteers again in these programs who are growing as coaches and training staff and I will continue to bring these good people through the Under 16 program. We have been giving our staff a great environment to grow and move into higher levels. I would like to thank all the coaches and trainers who were involved in these programs.

Danijel Herbut continued on as our SANFLW coach and although the results didn't go our way with only 2 wins from 10 games the players progressed well and I am confident of the results going our way in the future.



Danijel was well assisted by returning coaches John Zantvoort, Patrick Sim, Fabian Muller and Alice Johnswood. New coaches to the program were Mark Schutz who worked with the Forwards, Matt Lynn who worked with the Defenders and Dr. David Bentley who came on as our Strength and Conditioning Coach. I would like to make special mention to Kelly Roberts who was our Head Trainer for both Senior and Junior Women's Football in 2019. She did a wonderful job looking after all our players.

We had a squad of 45 players, and 12 players made their debut in 2019. We have continued to get a number of games into players aged 16-20 and these players will be the core that will take us forward for 10 plus years.

Both teams performed well on the field winning 2 of their 3 games against the other Adelaide Crows zoned SANFL teams.

It was wonderful to see a number of our SANFLW players being involved in the program as coaches and I would like to thank them all for giving up their time and running the best Junior Women's Program we have seen. A big thank you goes to Jackson Lane who won the new SANFL role in the Sturt Zone as Women's Talent Officer. In his first season as a Football Administrator he ran a sublime program.

This year we had 4 representatives in the State U16 program, Grace Powell, Zoe Prowse, Georgia Swan and Holly Temby. Zoe Prowse was awarded the medal for being Best on Ground in their one-off game against Victoria. In the U18's we had 3 players make the final squad of 25 who played 2 games against the Northern Territory. These players were Hannah Prenzler, Alex Ballard and Lucy Griffith. Congratulations to all.

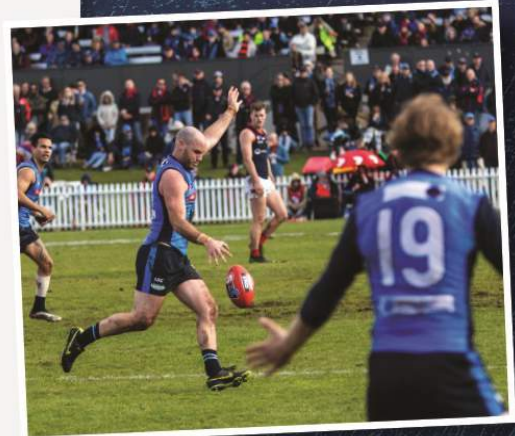

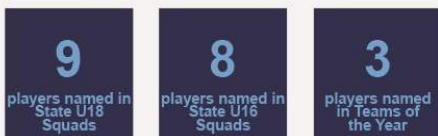

Sturt volunteer group The Baggies formed in late 2012 after past player Jack Stephens politely asked if the senior showers in the then McKay Grandstand rooms could be fixed. Only two out of eight jets worked.

The original Baggies were Sue Dewing, Peter Hall, Ken Hughes, Peter Kepler, Michael Kernot, Grant Nancarrow and Scott Rickards. This group not only funded the repairs to all showers and many other projects but embarked on a club maintenance program that occurs most Saturday mornings/early afternoon to this day.

Sadly Peter Hall passed away in early 2015 after a short illness. He left a huge hole at the Club and also within The Baggies, such that The Baggies remember him at the completion of each major project.

Since 2012 The Baggies have received additional help from time to time from Peter Berrett (deceased), Andrew Carter, Leanne Hill, Carol Hutchings, Jason Kilic, Damian Richardson and Stuart Shaw. Stephen Dillon joined the group and has continued to show up each week since 2017.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

PETER MOTLEY

Congratulations to Peter Motley who was inducted into the South Australian Football Hall of Fame in 2019.

Peter's extraordinary talents were obvious as far back as his early schooling at Belair Primary when named in the SAPSASA side. Then it was just down the road to Blackwood High where he rose to head prefect and captained the footy side which claimed the State schools championship.

He lived in Sturt's zone, but had the option to play for the Magpies because of his dad. His school mates wanted to stick together and play with the Double Blues so Peter had a decision to make and after the Blues invited him to join their colts side and given that there was absolutely no contact from Port Adelaide the Double Blues it was.

Named an All Australian after the Teal Cup Under 17 carnival, Peter played just 3 Senior colts games for the Double Blues before being promoted to the Reserves. Again, there were only another 3 games before he made his League debut in 1982 and in the following year he was selected in the State side and named an All Australian for the first time at just 18 years old.

Peter joined Carlton in the VFL in 1986 and played 19 games before his career was cut short due to a car accident in 1987.

BILL MAYMAN

Congratulations to the family of Bill Mayman who was also inducted into the South Australian Football Hall of Fame in 2019.

In 1913 he was recruited to the Double Blues and the following year the centreman took on the captaincy role. He was also named skipper of the SA side that year for the national carnival in Sydney and won the Double Blues best and fairest award.

Then in 1915 the Double Blues finally broke through for their first flag with Mayman also the coach leading the side superbly in a best-on-ground performance in the grand final triumph over Port Adelaide.

With the competition going into recess for World War 1 the Double Blues had to wait until 1919 to defend their crown and again it was Mayman taking charge in the win over North Adelaide in the memorable replay as captain-coach.

Mayman played 315 senior games in three States - WA, SA and TAS between 1906 and 1925 and achieved the rare honour of playing for all three in State football playing 28 interstate games in total.

AFLW GAME

It was three months of hard work and perfect manicuring of Unley Oval that had us playing on, what I believe, is the best suburban football ground in Adelaide on Sunday afternoon, and it got us our fifth win for the season over a competitive GWS Giants, 9.5 (59) to 4.3 (27).

During Friday night's captain run, I had a great conversation with the groundsman who had put a lot of time and energy into the ground.

As I came off the track from a running session, apologising for keeping him waiting, he was more interested in feedback about how it felt underfoot.

I realised that we all strive to excel and deliver the best performance and product we can, always seeking feedback to get better, whether that's as a player or if you are the groundsman providing us a well-kept oval to perform on.

On Friday night, I spoke to the team about Unley Oval and its history and significance. Growing up in the area being an avid Double Blues supporter, I feel like Unley Oval was a significant part of my childhood.

As a 13-year-old in the late '90s, I grew up kicking footballs into bins along the sideline while my brother trained and my dad coached at Sturt. I joked that Chloe Scheer would have only just been born that year. I would beg my dad to stay back and have a kick with me as they would come off the track, and that was my earliest memories of always wanting to play footy.

Ten years later, I would find myself in a Sturt guernsey playing in the South Australian Women's Football League (SAWFL) as a 23-year-old in a competition that had only four teams at the time. Fast forward another 10 years, and as a 33-year-old, the opportunity to play at the highest level was there.

That 13-year-old in the late '90s would never have dreamt of an AFLW match being played at a place that harboured my dreams of becoming a footballer for so long. I also shared with the group the significance of a family friend, Josh Deegan, who lost his life in the Bali Bombings — a place he went celebrating the 2002 Sturt Premiership — and our families' white pickets purchased at the oval sit side-by-side on the western boundary, the city-end of the oval.

Speaking with the girls after the game, they described it as the best atmosphere yet of the season, in front of a 7725-strong crowd.

So, what are the best grounds to play AFLW games on? For me, the boutique suburban atmosphere of a packed Unley Oval will always create that community, family-friendly feel.



BRENTON MIELS SERVICE AWARD

Brenton Miels was a champion player and a champion bloke. He played 201 league games for the Club and later worked tirelessly in the organisation of events and fundraising. This award is given to those who display the same selfless dedication and passion for Sturt Football Club and serves as a memorial to Brenton's outstanding service.

Off field, he was a pioneer of the computer industry in Adelaide working as a software designer and developer.

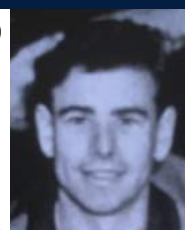


WILLIAM 'BILL' BOLAND

Robert was an inaugural inductee into the SA Football Hall of Fame in 2002 and in 2008 was awarded an Order of Australia Medal for his services to Australian football.



DAVID WARK SNR OAM

Beryl was instrumental in the introduction of the Club song "It's a Grand Old Flag", citing Len's observation that the Melbourne Football Club song could be adapted by changing the words red and blue to Double Blues and she also initiated the change to the Sturt guernsey adding the logo to the front in 1953.

The Tigers kicked 5 goals in the last quarter, but couldn't stop the rampaging Double Blues who added 8 goals and ran out winners by 65 points. The Sturt side with immaculate kicking and constructive handball had just given the Tigers a painful lesson in finals football and in the process kicked the highest score ever in a SANFL Grand Final. Better players were the magical Paul Bagshaw, full forward Malcolm Greenslade who kicked 9.4, half forward John Tilbrook with 4 goals, Darryl Hicks on the wing, back pocket Brenton Adcock, Sandy Nelson at centre half back and ruck rover Keith Chessell.

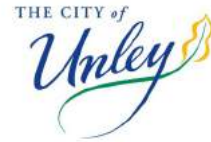

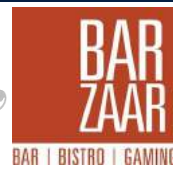
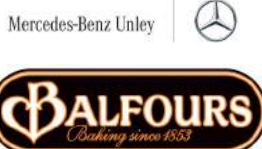
