We are prepared to make the necessary decisions, even unpopular ones, to secure the long-term financial health of the Club.

CEO Report

Season 2025 will long be remembered as a landmark year for Sturt Football Club. After the disappointment of last season where only our Under 16s claimed premiership success we undertook a thorough review of our football program.

It was clear that change was needed. Under the leadership of Senior Coach Marty Mattner, we embarked on an overhaul of our game plan, shifting to a more attacking brand of football while remaining true to the strong defensive identity that has long defined our Club. The results were nothing

short of exceptional. Marty, who shoulders the responsibility for developing our game plan, exceeded all expectations and just like that, our beloved Double Blues secured their 16th League Men's premiership.

Credit must also go to our players, who embraced the new style and maintained unwavering focus throughout the season. Their determination to atone for the previous year was evident from Round 1, and the rewards followed. Our Under 18s also delivered an outstanding premiership win, the Reserves played in the Grand Final and our Women's team progressed impressively to a Preliminary Final, further demonstrating the strength and depth of our entire football program.

Once again, our supporters turned out in force. Sturt recorded the highest home-match attendance in the SANFL, and it is little wonder that other clubs seek us out for SANFL Super Matches. Our members and supporters continue to travel in numbers, never hesitating to attend away games, and this loyal backing was on full display at the Grand Final.

Off the field, the Club delivered another strong financial performance, exceeding budgeted targets in sponsorship, membership, fundraising, merchandise, and match day income. The Business Development team, led by Renee Bartlett, played a key role in retaining and attracting partners and supporters. Major sponsors Morris and Thomas Farms enter their tenth consecutive year with us in 2026, an incredible testament to their commitment.

We were also delighted to welcome Wayville Hyundai, with Dealer Principal Dylan Nunn and his team quickly embedding themselves within our community.

Membership increased again, and as at January 2026 we were 27% ahead of the same time last year. Merchandise sales surged throughout finals, culminating in a 200% increase, which speaks to the passion of our supporter base and the exceptional service provided by our staff, particularly Kristy McGee.

Infrastructure projects were a major focus this year. The permanent perimeter fence at Unley Oval was approved by the City of Unley in August, and we are pleased to confirm that our original \$360,000 commitment has been bolstered by an additional \$30,000 raised through the Australian Sports Foundation thanks to the generosity of members, supporters, and community contributors. This project will significantly enhance match day operations and elevate the venue's presentation hosting State League and AFLW Australian Rules Football games.

We also secured a \$3.5 million federal commitment for Stage II of the second oval facilities at Urrbrae Agricultural High School. A vast amount of work went into achieving this outcome, positioning the Club strongly for the future as we develop contemporary, high-quality facilities for both our football programs and Urrbrae students.

Our most significant remaining challenge is the relocation of our hospitality venue, Jack's on Unley, as part of the Unley Central redevelopment. While we are supportive of this transformational project, the task of relocating a gaming venue is both complex and time-consuming. President Jason Kilic and I continue to work closely with government and key stakeholders to secure an outcome that safeguards the Club's future. It is likely that borrowings will be required for the first time in many years, but this will represent a prudent and necessary investment in our long-term sustainability.

Despite the Club's strong on and off field performance, and the associated revenue growth, the high cost of delivering our extensive football programs means the Club operates at an operational loss. It is the exceptional performance of Jack's on Unley, under the leadership of Toni Boscence, that enables the Group to return an operational surplus. Securing a timely and viable relocation solution is therefore critical to our financial stability and future success.

I extend my sincere thanks to our Board, staff, players, coaches, officials, and volunteers for their dedication, and acknowledge departing Football Manager Chris Trapp for his ten years of outstanding service. To our members your loyalty and passion continue to inspire us. This is your Club, and we are proud to share this success with you.

Senior Men's Coach Report

Season 2025 was a near perfect year, culminating in a well deserved premiership. The campaign marked a significant evolution in our style of play, with results exceeding expectations particularly in how quickly the improvement became evident.

Following a thorough review of the previous season, it was clear that change was required. We made a deliberate decision to place greater emphasis on the offensive component of our game plan. The playing group made substantial gains throughout the pre-season, and early trial matches provided encouraging glimpses of what we were aiming to achieve.



As the season commenced, the team delivered strong performances and demonstrated a clear shift towards a more dynamic, higher scoring brand of football. By mid year, the benefits of our redefined approach were fully emerging. Consistent weekly reviews and a commitment to continual improvement resulted in an offensive system that flourished late in the season, producing several convincing victories. Our only loss came in the final minor round game, a narrow two-point defeat to Adelaide.

Finishing as minor premiers provided us with a week off to begin our finals campaign, an experience new to both me and the playing group. The players and coaches embraced this opportunity, using it to prepare meticulously for finals at Adelaide Oval. Strong preparation and disciplined planning enabled us to score 100 points in both finals, recording winning margins of 42 and 31 points.

The Grand Final highlighted our best football, particularly in a dominant first half in which Glenelg was restricted to just two goals. The game opened up in the third quarter, with us kicking seven goals to four. Although Glenelg closed the margin late in the game, our control across the second half secured a 31 point victory. Angus Anderson was awarded the Jack Oatey Medal for best on ground, and Josh Hone contributed four goals.

The collective improvement of the entire playing group, along with the emergence of several key individuals, was instrumental in delivering the ultimate success. Several players enjoyed exceptional seasons. Tom Lewis produced one of the most decorated individual seasons in recent memory, winning the Magarey Medal, R.O. Shearman Medal, SANFL Now Player of the Year, The Advertiser Player of the Year, and the Club Champion P.T. Morton Medal.

Josh Hone led the Club's goal kicking with 52 goals from 20 games, finishing fourth in the Ken Farmer Medal.

Seven Sturt players were selected in the SANFL Team of the Year: Tom Lewis (Vice-Captain), Angus Anderson, Will Coomblas, Sam Conforti, Josh Hone, Will Snelling, and Casey Voss.

Will Coomblas, Tom Lewis, Flynn Perez, Will Snelling, and Casey Voss played in the State games against the WAFL and VFL.

At season's end, premiership players Henry Carey, Luke Giacometti, James Mathews and Connor McFadyen announced their retirement from Sturt. Each played a vital role in our 2025 premiership and made a significant impact throughout their time at the Club. We thank them for their contribution and wish them well in their future endeavours.

Female Programs Report

The 2025 SANFLW League season resulted in a seven win, seven loss record at the end of the minor round and a finals berth. We had a strong win in the Elimination Final against North Adelaide but were unfortunately knocked out by eventual premiers, South Adelaide in the Preliminary Final. Throughout the season we played some good football in patches however we need to improve our consistency as we strive towards delivering the club's first SANFLW premiership.

We had 11 debutants this season, nine of those products of our junior program highlighting the club's strong junior development pathway. Our SANFLW Development League team finished with four wins and three losses with several young players showing promising signs to push for League selection in the future.



Congratulations to retiree Molly Fletcher on a great career and to Jasmin Fejo who has an opportunity with the Adelaide Lightning in the WNBL. Both players have had a tremendous impact on our program.

I would like to thank outgoing head coach Michael O'Connor, for his significant contribution to the women's program in his four years in the role.

There were several individual achievements during the 2025 season including four players representing the SA Under 18 team – Monique Bessen, Summer Ross, Lily Smart and Sophie Thredgold while three players represented the SA Under 16 team – Charlotte Copson, Maddi Nuss and Lily Whiteman.

Isobel Kuiper and Monique Bessen were selected in the SANFLW Team of the Year. Kuiper also finished 2nd in the SANFLW Coaches Award and 4th in the SANFLW Best & Fairest Count. Monique Bessen went on to be selected at pick 40 by Fremantle Football Club in the 2025 Telstra AFLW Draft.

Thank you to all the staff and volunteers who put so much time and effort into the women's program, it is greatly appreciated and I thoroughly enjoyed working with you this season.

As we look towards season 2026, I would like to welcome Ange Foley who has been appointed as Sturt's new SANFLW Head Coach, she will bring a lot of knowledge to the program with her AFLW experience.

Under 18 Report

The 2025 season was an outstanding year for the Sturt Under 18 program, culminating in a Premiership victory that highlighted the depth, talent, and commitment within our playing group.

The team's success was built on a foundation of strong development, resilience, and a genuine team-first mindset that reflected the Club's values both on and off the field



Our program proudly produced six State representatives this year, Harley Barker, Blake Thredgold, Noah Roberts-Thomson, Louis Kellaway, Jett Dahlitz, and Kale Matthews-Hampton – a testament to the quality of our player development. In addition, ten of our players were selected in the Under 17 Futures Program, with four (Hugo Jaeschke, Kale Matthews-Hampton, Taj Garrett, and Harvey Chapman) progressing to the 2026 State Hub. These achievements reinforce the program's role in nurturing elite talent and preparing players for higher-level football.

One of the key challenges throughout the season was player availability due to overlapping college football commitments. With over 60 players involved across the year, balancing opportunity, support, and individual development required careful management and collaboration among staff. Despite these challenges, the group remained united and focused, leading to a highly successful campaign.

Looking ahead, the outlook for the Under 18 program is exceptionally strong. With 11 bottom-age players contributing to our Grand Final win and set to return in 2026, the foundation is in place for continued success.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all coaches and support staff for their expertise, professionalism, and tireless work in ensuring our program remains one of the highest quality in the competition.

Sturt has secured back-to-back Stanley H. Lewis Trophies as SANFL's best performed club in 2025.

In the fifth year of points being awarded for Women's and U16 matches, the Double Blues finished with a significant tally of 3662.5, ahead of runner-up Glenelg with 3237.5.

With its Hostplus SANFL League team minor premier, Sturt's tally was also boosted by its Under 18's finishing at the top of the table. South Adelaide tallied 2900 to round out the top three, finishing clear of the Eagles on 2850 in fourth and fifth-placed Central on 2750.

Sturt has now won the Stanley H. Lewis Trophy on six occasions with other successes coming in 2024, 2008, 1983, 1978 and 1968.

The Trophy, named after past SANFL Chairman Stanley Heathcote Lewis, has been awarded since 1962 to the club which has displayed excellence across all grades of football.

Points are awarded for each win across the minor round, with 100 points allocated for a Men's and Women's League victory, 50 points for the Reserves and Under 18's and 25 points for the Under 16's.

In the event of a draw, half of the points allocated for a win in that grade are awarded to each club involved.

Under 16 Report

The campaign started in November 2024 with 129 players invited to trial for the 2025 program. The coaching team remained the same from the 2024 premiership team.

Urrbrae Agricultural High School, The Summit and Cornerstone College were utilised as pre-season training venues. Trials were conducted through to Christmas. The squad was reduced to 63 players for the resumption of training in the new year. This included 16 Under 15 players.



Squad selection was again a 50/50 mix of private and state school players. This mix continues to be a challenge with an increase of country zoned players attending private school.

Training over the preseason was of a high standard, and the coaching team were focussed on a program of developing football fundamentals, complimenting a Sturt structured game plan.

Matches started in mid-March, with our early home games scheduled to be played at The Summit, Mt Barker.

At the completion of Round 7, the team were top of the table, having only one defeat.

After Round 7 the college football competition commenced resulting in 18 changes for the next game. Selection was also compromised (but in a good way) by having six players selected in the State Under 16 Squad, with Harvey Chapman named Captain, and Taj Garrett Vice Captain. Both these players gained All Australian selection and went on to play important roles in the Sturt Under 18 finals campaign.

The previously mentioned Under 15 group also provided six members of the State Under 15 school boys' team, with Sam Casey and Jacob Westley selected All Australians.

Being unable to select from our best players for most of the games after Round 7, gave opportunity for others, but also did not allow for a balanced team selection, something out of our control.

Exit interviews were held post season followed by a presentation night held in the Thomas Room, to celebrate the season and award best players.

Under 14 Report

The 2025 campaign started in October 2024 with a group of around 80 players trying out for the SANFL Under 14 competition. Full training for selected players started in January 2025.

Due to a multitude of other sporting commitments, a squad of 39 was selected for the program to enable a balanced selection each week of the fixture.

Training during the year was run in conjunction with the Under 16 and Under 18 programs on a Tuesday and Thursday night. There was no fitness component to this program. The focus was on football fundamentals, Sturt structures and SANFL rules.

The squad had a different dynamic this year, with several players involved at a high level in other sports. This did impact training numbers and the ability to plan training sessions.

The lads played games to the expectations of the coaching team, and several players were asked to train on with the Under 16 squad for the remainder of the season. Two players were selected to play an Under 16 game towards the end of the program.

The program was again an insight into the talent within our zone, with the challenges of school footy an ongoing concern.

The pre-season training facility with lights at Urrbrae Agricultural High School will help our program at the change of season in March/April. This project should commence in 2026 and be ready for the 2027 season.

Medical Report

2025 was an extremely busy year for the Medical and Training Staff – a group comprising Sports Trainers (9), Physiotherapists (6), Sports Doctors (8), Specialists and Rehabilitation staff.

The pre-Xmas training block commenced in November, 2024 and resumed in the second week of January, 2025. Medical support was provided across five days of each week, preparing players for training and games.



During pre-season, these training sessions and matches were spread across Urrbrae Agricultural High School, Cornerstone College and Mount Barker Summit which necessitates significant travel - an enormous commitment to ensure our players in all programs receive quality, timely care. In the senior men's program, 70 injuries were assessed, treated and rehabilitated - the major type being hamstring (9) and calf (8) soft tissue injuries of varying grades/severity and concussions (6) which were managed according to SANFL/AFL protocols.

Across our male programs physiotherapists (Tom Lancaster; Jake Szabo; Tara Smith; Daniel Fahey-Sparks) provided 526 'in-house' consultations at training to injured players.

Match day medical coverage was coordinated by Sportsmed's Dr. Shahram Shahrokhi and his PA, Alison Sohal, who ensured that a doctor was present at all senior men fixtures.

There are eight doctors who provide this important and essential coverage on a rostered, voluntary basis.

In addition, Dr. Damian Newberry and Dr. Angela Moran provide GP (Sports Doctor) support at Sportsmed. Physiotherapists, James Mack and Danielle Tape along with Sports Trainer/Physio Student, Sophie Helbig, provided medical coverage for the SANFLW program.

Hayley Sutton (Centre of Excellence, Head Trainer) and her team of four sports trainers provided medical coverage to our three underage teams with support from myself in a mentoring role.

Female Programs

Medical Report

Physiotherapists James Mack and Danielle Tape from The Athlete Lab provided consistent and highly valued medical coverage for the Club's women's program throughout the 2025 season. Their involvement ensured timely assessment, diagnosis and management of injuries, as well as ongoing rehabilitation support for players across both training and match-day environments.

Their professionalism, availability and close collaboration with coaches and football department staff contributed significantly to maintaining player welfare and facilitating safe and efficient return-to-play outcomes. They were ably supported by sports trainers Sophie Helbig and Saskia Jonats, whose commitment on training nights and match days ensured a high standard of immediate care, strapping, injury monitoring and player support across the season.



During the 2025 season, a total of 68 new injury incidents were reported and formally assessed by the medical team. These incidents ranged in severity and complexity, reflecting the physical demands and intensity of SANFLW football.

While injuries were recorded across multiple body regions, lower limb injuries remained the most prevalent, with knee, ankle and foot issues accounting for the majority of presentations. This trend aligns with the high running loads, change-of-direction movements and contact demands inherent in the women's game.

Ongoing injury surveillance and targeted prevention strategies will remain a focus moving forward, with the medical team continuing to work closely with strength and conditioning and coaching staff to minimise injury risk and optimise player availability throughout the season.

Festoon lighting and outdoor heating enhanced the experience ensuring a warm and welcoming environment as fans enjoyed the action on and off the field. The enduring rivalry between Sturt and Norwood once again provided the centrepiece for a memorable celebration of SANFL football.
